FROM THE VICARAGE

This month we have an unexpected but very important General Election. The people who are elected as MPs will have the responsibility of steering our nation through the next five years. As we vote, we all have our own ideas of the direction we think our nation should be heading in – of what sort of nation we would like to see in five years’ time. I wonder if we ever think of what direction we think our church should be heading in? What sort of church would we like to see in our villages in five years’ time? That will bring new challenges to our churches and now is the time to start preparing for those challenges. How do we see the church? As a place just for weddings and christenings and funerals? There are not as many of them as there should be! The churches here have not paid their way for a number of years now and it is the generous support of other churches in the area which help us to balance our finances. Tough times lie ahead for the churches in our two villages and they are your churches – Vicars come and go – but the people stay – it is their church – it is YOUR church. Use it or lose it.
